On 15th October, 2014, hundreds of tourists were walking in the Himalayas. Suddenly, a snowstorm started and that soon created an avalanche. In a short time, up to two metres of snow was covering people on the mountain. Linor Kajan was one of those people. The snow was almost up to her shoulders and she couldn't move or see anything in the heavy storm. Luckily, a Nepalese guide found her and lifted her out of the snow. Then, he pulled her through the snow to a small café full of frightened tourists. They were all lucky to be alive. Thirty-nine people died in the avalanche that day.

Can people predict snowstorms and prevent future disasters? A week earlier, there was a hurricane near India and the hurricane travelled in the direction of Nepal. When storms reach very cold places, they become snowstorms. So it probably was possible to predict the weather on the Himalayas that day and prevent a terrible disaster. Unfortunately, people didn't think of that at the time.
